Central Water Supply - latest News

The construction of the Pugwash water system is nearing completion. Here are some highlights for the upcoming construction season:

- · Work will continue to complete the transmission line through the woods to the wellfield in Rockley.
- The water treatment building structure was completed this winter, installation of the treatment process equipment, electrical and communications systems will be completed this summer.
- · Site work associated with the reservoir in West Pugwash will start the first week of July. The reservoir will be assembled in August.
- · Pipe work associated with the ex-

tension to Gulf Shore, Pugwash Point and the fire hall on Route 6 will begin after July 1.

- In an effort to help residents make an informed decision regarding connecting to the system, we will be providing free water testing to all developed properties to be served by the system. Watch for an information handout in the coming days which will explain how to sign up for testing.
- There will be an Information Session at the Village Hall, June 19th from





Canada Day is a special day every year, but with 2017 being the year of Canada's 150th anniversary of confederation; this will be a Canada Day to remember in Pugwash! The normal Canada Day and Gathering of the Clans events will go ahead as usual, with the exception of the Highland Dance competition [see Page 5] and the midway will be open Friday and Saturday!

Pugwash HarbourFest (PHF) activities centre around the tall ships when they come to Pugwash, sometimes having to change their usual late July date to coincide with their arrival. After a five year absence, the Tall Ships are coming to Pugwash to coincide with Canada 150, moving HarbourFest events along to add to the celebrations. The combined extravaganza has become known as "Pugwash Celebrates". Please check out page 5 for all the events, correct as of going to press on June 15th. Please be aware that some late changes may be made.

Due to how the funding for the Tall Ship visits is structured for Canada 150, there will



be no fees charged to access or tour the visiting vessels Atyla, Geronimo and Katie Belle.

Please note: Because of regulations imposed by the Ministry of Transport, all those who wish to enter the restricted area must have valid photo ID and be willing to undergo a random bag search-like at the airport. Signs to such effect will be posted. For safety reasons, no children under 12 will be granted access without an accompanying parent or guardian. All bags, purses and such-must be left at the dock with our "coat-check" team before accessing the ships. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

Many PHF activities will be held on the salt mine wharf – otherwise known as the K+S Windsor "Salt Shaker". Other popular family events, including the Soapbox Derby, Got Bobbled and the Recycled Regatta, will be found in other parts of downtown Pugwash. There will be maps posted to help residents and visitors find their favourite events.



These celebrations could not have been brought together so smoothly without the continuing support from the Village, County, Province and Federal governments, Waterfront Development Corporation Limited, sponsors, in-kind supporters and volunteers.

Some of this funding has paid for additional floating docks. Once the festivities are over, they will installed for the rest of the summer at Dinghy beach. This will create the "HarbourFest Horseshoe" which will provide an enclosed area at the beach for younger, inexperienced swimmers as well as additional temporary berthing for small watercraft, expanded canoe and kayak launches and more.

The Gathering of the Clans and Pugwash HarbourFest welcome any new volunteers who would like to help with events, work on a committee or as other means of contributing to these festivals. Please contact us at any time.
