# 7.4 North Cumberland Historical Society

#### 8 COMMITTEE REPORTS

- 8.1 Standing Committees
  - 8.1.1 **Accessibility** [Betts/MacEwan]

Betts: The volume of work and studies keeps rising. Accessibility week is at the end of May. The Village has a flag to fly and stickers and buttons to share. At a recent online meeting on active living with a group from a wide range of interests in accessibility, all independently agreed that the greatest single challenge to accessing programs and facilities is transportation.

Reducing board meetings from four to three per year. The nomination committee will remain as a one member. Villages that run water treatment facilities had been able to work together to reverse a decision by Property Valuation Services to tax these facilities. Municipal owned facilities are not taxed. A committee will investigate the proposal to have hired staff and will report at the AGM at Port Williams in September.
