#### **New Pugwash Library Close to Completion**

Over \$600,000 was raised locally to go towards the costs of this 3,700 sq ft building. The project is on financial and timing target with a budget of nearly \$2.2million. In this downtown location, it will be fully accessible with plenty of parking, space inside for small meetings and programs and stupendous views of Pugwash Harbour and river.

#### **North Cumberland Health Care facility Progress**

Construction of the new facility in Pugwash is progressing well, with siding on the backside of the building complete and stonework from Wallace Quarries underway on the front. In the interior, electrical and ventilation installation is underway, and drywall work continues. The landscaping design is coming to life with retaining wall blocks, curbing, lighting, and walkways started around the building. The building exte-

rior is nearly weather tight for the winter months with the exterior doors arriving soon. Interior finish work, procurement of new equipment, and operational planning will continue over the next several months with the expectation to be open to patients in the spring of 2023.

As we transition from the old building to the new, the planning team will work with the community



and the North Cumberland Community Health Foundation to celebrate and capture the history of North Cumberland Memorial Hospital. #### The Route Six Snowmobile Club

It is that time of a year when we consider our recreational options for the winter months. Pugwash, Oxford, Wallace and Tatamagouche have excellent access to the Trail 260 (Trans Canada Trail) which is groomed all winter.

Though primarily used for snowmobiles, the groomed system is also a wonderful trail system for hikers, snowshoeing and cross-country skiing. Route 260, 265 to Wallace -Quarry Branch Trail- and route 263 to Pugwash -Pugwash Salt Express-are all designated multi-use rail-trails in winter. Trailheads are open for parking and mostly looked after by volunteers.

We thank WADA in Wallace at the ballfield, Cunningham Construction in Pugwash near the Salt Mine and the Town of Oxford at Water Street, for providing winter parking areas. Note snowmobile passes are available from Tyler Rushton and Mike Wood Autobody (Oxford); Crossroads Cycle (Pugwash); Rite Stop Gas Station (Wallace) and Darren Patriquin. THANK-YOU to all who have helped restore our trails. There is still lots to do, but with everyone working together we should have our trails open in time for snow.
